# What is an apprenticeship?




- An apprenticeship is a real job where you learn, gain experience and get paid. It is an alternative to college and you can apply for an apprenticeship at any point after the age of 16.
- You are an employee with a contract of employment and holiday leave.
- By the end of an apprenticeship, you will have the right skills and knowledge needed for your chosen career.
- It can take between one and six years to complete an apprenticeship depending on which apprenticeship you choose, what level it is, and your qualifications.
- It's funded from contributions made by the government and your employer.



# **Levels of apprenticeships**



- In England, there are currently four levels of apprenticeship: intermediate, advanced, higher and degree. They all involve a work-based learning programme and lead to nationally recognised qualifications.
- The level of apprenticeship you start at will depend on the qualifications you have, the job role, and apprenticeship standard the employer wants to use.

# Level 2

Intermediate apprenticeship Equivalent to GCSE passes at grades 4–9

# Level 3

Advanced apprenticeship Equivalent to A-Level passes

### Higher apprenticeship

Equivalent to a higher education certificate/ diploma or a foundation degree (first year of a degree)

Levels 4-7

# Levels 6-7

#### Degree

#### apprenticeship

Level 6 is equivalent to a bachelor's degree. Level 7 is equivalent to a master's degree.

# Top tips when applying



#### Search and apply using Find an apprenticeship (findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk)

(This link has been sent to you on your school email)

- Start applying for jobs that interest you. Make sure you check the following before applying:
  - ✓ Start date you can only apply for apprenticeships that will **<u>start</u> after you have finished Rushey Mead.**
  - ✓ Do you have the correct entry requirements for the apprenticeship you are applying for?
  - ✓ Where will your training take place?
  - ✓ How far away is it from your home address?

#### Do your research!

• Look at the different jobs that are being advertised. Try different searches or extend how far you are looking to find jobs that you are interested in.

Typically, there will be lots of apprenticeships for you to choose from!
