# GCSE FRENCH: Reading and Listening Revision Checklist (I) Vocabulary Practice (Higher)

- You will have a final reading and listening exam at the end of Y11 (May).
- Each of these exams is worth 25% of your final GCSE grade. There is no coursework.
- To prepare for these exams, learn the vocabulary listed on this checklist (please turn over).
- All vocabulary included on this checklist comes up regularly on AQA reading and listening exams.
- Learn the vocabulary in the order stated as it starts with the most important.
- You only need to be able to <u>RECOGNISE</u> these words (translate from French to <u>English</u>).

# **Knowledge Organisers**

Knowledge organisers are a great revision tool because they map out the essential knowledge you need to master <u>as a minimum</u> in order to succeed in your exams.

There is a knowledge organiser for each group of vocabulary listed on the checklist overleaf **(turn over).** These can be found on the Student Shared Area (sign in using Foldr):

#### How to use:

- ✓ Cover the English and try to translate each French word into English aloud.
- ✓ After translating each word, check if you are right.
- ✓ Highlight or star the words you got wrong or didn't know.
- ✓ Memorise these words by chanting the French and English aloud.
- ✓ Cover the English and test yourself again.
- ✓ Repeat until you can confidently translate all words into English.
- ✓ Get someone to test you by pointing at or saying aloud a word at random for you to translate.

- ✓ Go to www.quizlet.com or download the app for free on your phone or tablet.
- ✓ Search for RushevMFLVocabTests
- ✓ Filter by class and find the class called 'GCSE Reading + Listening Vocabulary Higher'
- ✓ Find the set of flashcards you need and complete activities in the following order.

## 1. Use the 'Flashcard' function

- Click on 'options' > answer with <u>English</u>
- Click 'play'. Go through each flashcard, listen to the French and say the <u>English</u> meaning before the card flips over.
- Star the words you do not know confidently and continue to test yourself.

## 2. Use the 'Match' function

Match the French and English words as quickly as possible

## 3. Use the 'Learn' function

- Click on 'options' > Answer with <u>English</u>, Question type '<u>Written Questions'</u>
- o Test yourself by typing in English meaning of each French word
