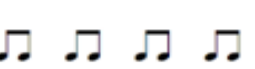
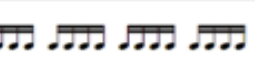
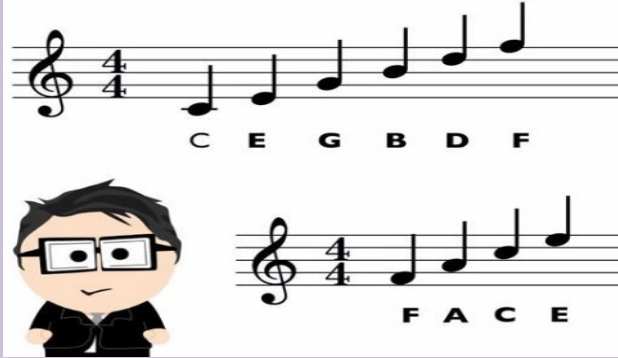
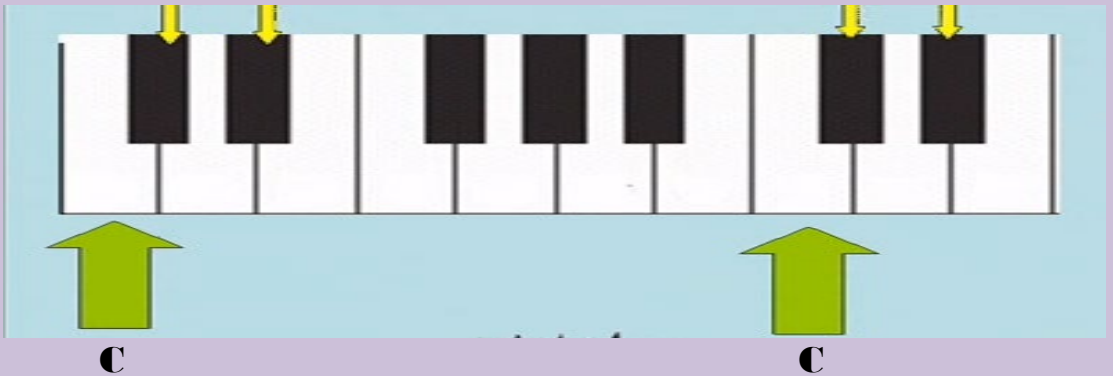
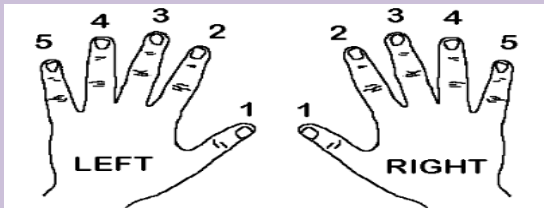


Year 7 Unit 1. Knowledge Map – Building our Music Community

Key vocabulary / concepts	What knowledge is required:				
<i>Pulse</i>	The pulse is the steady beat that continues throughout the music				
<i>Tempo</i>	The music word for the speed of the pulse in music. Describing how fast or slow it is.				
<i>Rhythm</i>	The musical word for a strong regular patterns of beats . Often repeating.				
<i>Cross-Rhythm</i> <i>Polyrhythm</i>	Different rhythms playing at the same time over each other				
<i>Duration</i>	The musical word for how long a note lasts . Eg. One beat long four beats long etc.				
<i>Rest</i>	The musical word for silences or gaps of different lengths in the music.				
<i>4/4 Bar Bar-line</i>	FOUR one beats in each bar. A bar is one small section of music divided by bar lines				
<i>Repeat sign</i>	Two dots at the end of a bar tells you to repeat that section				
<i>NOTE SYMBOLS</i> <i>REST SYMBOLS</i> <i>AND</i> <i>NOTE LENGTHS</i>		Note	Rest	Beats	1 ⁴/₄ measure

<i>Count in</i>	The Count-in is at the start of a song eg. 1,2,3,4 1. SETS THE TEMPO 2. TELLS MUSICIANS WHEN TO COME IN TOGETHER				
<i>Percussion</i>	The percussion family is the largest in the orchestra. Percussion instruments include any instrument that makes a sound when it is hit, shaken, or scraped.

<i>Un-tuned percussion</i>	The correct place to put each finger when playing the piano properly				
<i>Tuned percussion</i>	FOUR one beats in each bar. A bar is one small section of music divided by bar lines

Key vocabulary / concepts	What knowledge is required:
Pitch	The tuning of a note - High or Low given the letter names A B C D E F and G
Melody	The musical word for a series of single notes that make up the tune
Stave	5 lines with 4 spaces to show note pitches [the note ladder]  Can be remembered by saying: Every Good Boy Deserves Football for the line names F A C E in the space for the space names
Treble Clef	 Used on a stave to show higher pitch (treble) notes will be played. Also known as a G clef as it curls around the G line
Piano Keyboard	Remember how to find the note names on a keyboard by saying C IS TO THE LEFT OF THE 2 BLACK KEYS then using your alphabet to count 
Finger position	The correct place to put each finger when playing the piano properly. 
Bass line	These are the lower pitched notes often played with your left hand as an accompaniment to the Melody.
